### TRANSPORTATION

#### **Make the transportation system safer.**

1. Develop education campaigns on bicycle, pedestrian and traffic safety.
2. Reduce traffic speeds and improve crossings on streets with high volumes of pedestrian activity.
3. Implement improvements to make streets safer for pedestrians, cyclists and drivers.
4. Improve safety at rail crossings.

#### **Create a transportation system that supports active living and healthy lifestyles.**

1. Support multiple modes of transportation by providing a mix of land uses in a compact, walkable pattern.
2. Increase levels of transit service throughout the City.
3. Expand bicycle and walking infrastructure to reduce driving and increase physical activity.

#### **Create a high quality pedestrian network so residents can walk safely and comfortably.**

1. Locate and repair gaps in the sidewalk network.
2. Build more crosswalks
3. Improve lighting at crosswalks
4. Restriping existing crosswalks
5. Create a citywide pedestrian master plan.
6. Build benches, plazas, resting spots, and other pedestrian amenities.

**Create a bicycle and multi-use trail network that enables cycling for both recreation and transportation.**

1. Build more on –street bike network.
2. Create a citywide bicycle network of off-road bike trails and provide linkages to regional bike trails.
3. Provide more secure bike parking and storage and incentivize private property owners to do the same.
4. Create a citywide bicycle mobility plan.
5. Expand bicycle education programs.

**Ensure that children have safe access to schools and parks.**

1. Improve pedestrian safety around schools.
2. Improve pedestrian safety around parks.
3. Create a priority list of physical improvements needed around schools and parks.
4. Enhance programs that encourage students to walk to school.
5. Pursue safe-routes-to-schools funding.
6. Work with the school district to address traffic safety around schools.

## HEALTH CARE AND MENTAL HEALTH CARE

**Improve physical access to health care for City residents.**

1. Improve transportation access to health care facilities in El Monte.
2. Explore the use of mobile or remote health care (e.g., E-Health Care; Clinics on Wheels)

**Support a variety of healthcare and mental health facilities.**

1. Provide information on existing health care facilities and services.
2. Recruit and provide financial incentives for new healthcare facilities.
3. Design new facilities to be transit-accessible and pedestrian-friendly.
4. Encourage the co-location of healthcare and mental health services.
